Contest Rules:

1. Must be a 4th -12th grade student (including 2026 graduates) and a Michigan resident.
2. Awards are given in three levels of competition. Students starting these grade level for 2025-26 school year:
Level I: 4th – 6th Grade
Level II: 7th – 9th Grade
Level III: 10th – 12th Grade
3. All entries must be original short stories based on the assigned theme. *“My day with a famous Polish American hero.”* Panelists judge creativity, grammar, and following rules.
4. Entries must be original, not previously published or awarded in any other competition. All entries must be typed, double spaced, 500 - 1000 words. Participants may submit only one entry. Entries may be in English or in Polish. No Artificial Intelligence (AI) is permitted.
5. Send entries to: info@friendsofpolishart.org along with the attached “Entry Form/Permission Slip”.

 - Please put your name only on the “Entry Form/Permission Slip”.
 - Your literary submission should be a Word or PDF attachment.
6. **Deadline for entries is September 30, 2026.** Award recipients will be notified by October 15, 2026, and announced at the October FPA General Membership Meeting.
7. Prizes:
Level I: 1st Place \$100; 2nd Place \$75; 3rd Place \$50
Level II: 1st Place \$125, 2nd Place \$100; 3rd Place \$75
Level III: 1st Place \$200, 2nd Place \$150; 3rd Place \$100
(1st Place Award for Level III will be matched by FPA donor, for a total of \$400.)
8. Winning stories may be published on the Friends of Polish Arts website and/or in the FPA newsletter. Submission of stories constitutes a copyright license to the Friends of Polish Arts (FPA) to publish and/or reprint the winning stories should FPA choose to do so without royalties or other fees. By submitting the story, the entrants represent that they have the right to grant this license.
